THIRD INTELLECTUAL OUTPUT (IO3)

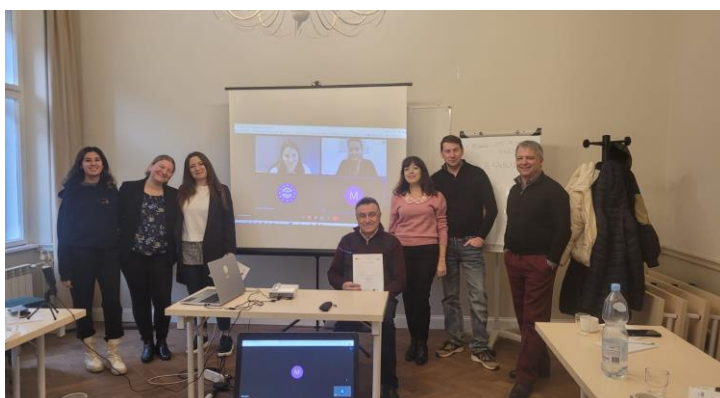
The partnership meeting focused on the final activities of the IO3 results - Development of training materials. Modules are developed on 5 different topics:

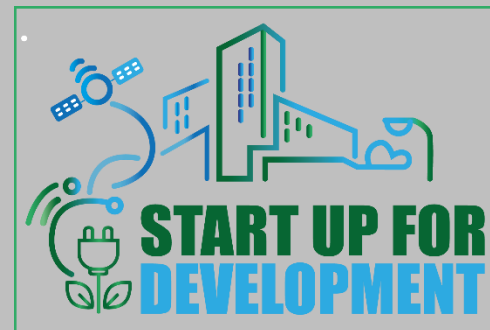
FOURTH INTELLECTUAL OUTPUT (IO4)

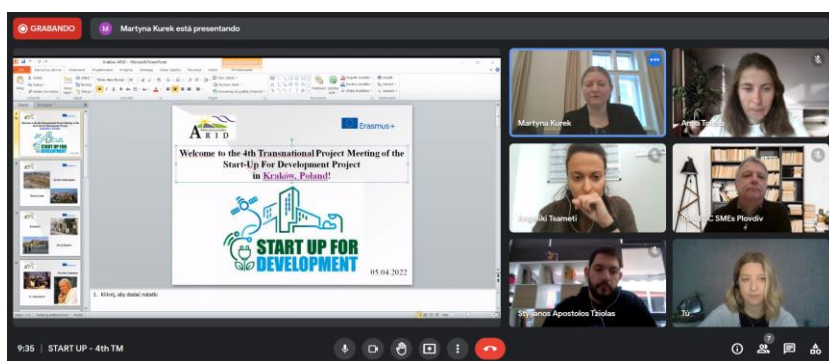

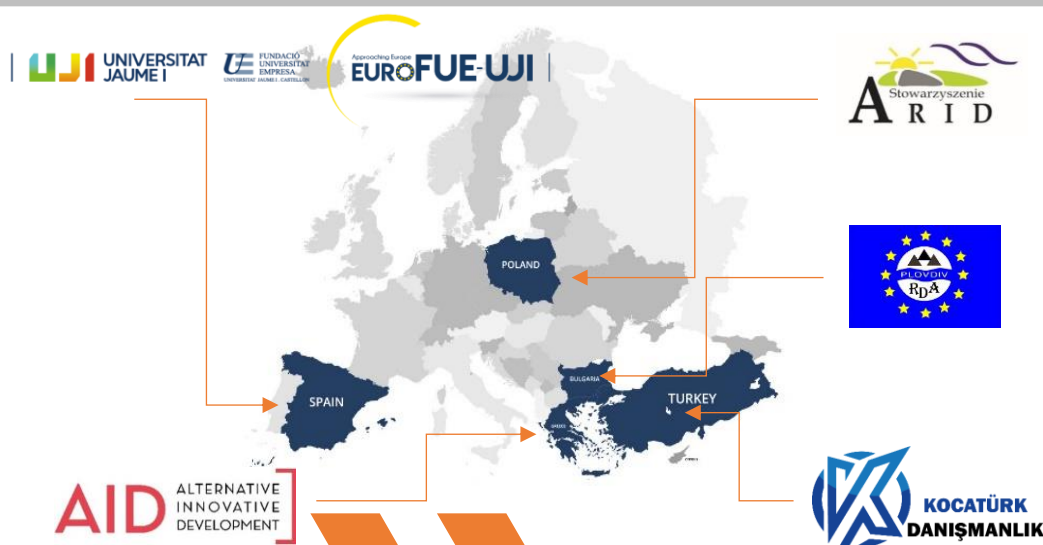
